RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers defeated the Toronto Blue Jays 5-1 yesterday afternoon at Rogers Centre. Armando Galarraga (2-0) held the Blue Jays scoreless over 5.1 innings of work to earn the victory. Ivan Rodriguez led the Tigers offense with four hits, including a double and an RBI. Edgar Renteria finished the game with two hits, including a solo home run. Ryan Raburn collected two RBI to round out the Tigers offense. The Tigers kick off a six-game homestand tonight with the first game of a three-game series against the Texas Rangers. The Los Angeles Angels round out the homestand with a three-game series beginning Friday.

ORDONEZ ON TARGET AGAINST RANGERS: In 72 career games against the Texas Rangers, Magglio Ordonez is batting .360 (95x264) with 52 runs scored, 21 doubles, 13 home runs and 48 RBI. He is third among active players with the .360 batting average, while he is seventh with a .587 slugging percentage and 10th with a .410 on-base percentage.

RENTERIA'S RED HOT: Edgar Renteria has been swinging a hot bat, hitting safely in 11 of his last 13 games dating back to April 9. Renteria is batting .360 (18x50) with 10 runs scored, three doubles, three home runs and 12 RBI during that stretch. He is tied for third in the American League during that stretch with three home runs, while he is tied for fourth with 12 RBI and a .600 slugging percentage.

HAPPY AT HOME: In 70 games at Comerica Park dating back to May 10, 2007, Magglio Ordonez is hitting .398 (105x264) with 58 runs scored, 25 doubles, 16 home runs and 62 RBI. He has reached base safely via a hit or walk in 64 of the games.

LOPEZ ON THE LEADER BOARDS: Aquilino Lopez tossed 1.1 scoreless innings yesterday afternoon against the Blue Jays and remains among the American League relief pitching leaders. He is currently tied for the lead among league relievers with 14.1 innings pitched, while he is tied for eighth with 10 strikeouts and tied for ninth with nine appearances.

CABRERA SHARES AL PLAYER OF THE WEEK AWARD: Major League Baseball announced yesterday that Miguel Cabrera was named the American League Co-Player of the Week for the week of April 14th. Cabrera shared the award with Boston's Manny Ramirez after batting .429 (12x28) with four doubles, two home runs and 11 RBI during the week. It is the fifth weekly honor for Cabrera and his first in the American League.

WALK THIS WAY: The Tigers have collected 83 walks through the first 20 games this season and rank third in the American League. Additionally, five Tigers players have collected three-or-more walks in a game this season, matching the club's total for games with at least three walks in 2007.

MAGGLIO CLOSING IN ON 1,000 RBI: Magglio Ordonez finished Friday night's game against Toronto with one RBI and is now one RBI shy of reaching 1,000 in his major league career. Ordonez would become just the second Venezuelan native to reach 1,000 RBI, joining Andres Galarraga (1,425).

GUILLEN AMONG THE EARLY LEADERS: Carlos Guillen ranks among the early leaders in the American League in a number of categories. Guillen ranks fourth with a .576 slugging percentage, while he is tied for fourth with seven doubles and 10 extra-base hits, fifth with a .429 on-base percentage and ninth with a .333 batting average.

RUNNING WILD: The Tigers have been successful in all 10 of their stolen bases attempts this season. Dating back to September 18, 2007, the club has been successful in each of its last 20 stolen bases attempts.

CRUCETA ASSIGNED TO TRIPLE A TOLEDO: Francisco Cruceta has been assigned to Triple A Toledo today, an assignment that can last a maximum of 16 days. Cruceta was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on November 30, 2007.

GRANDY'S REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Curtis Granderson started in center field for Single A West Michigan last night as part of a rehab assignment. He finished the game 1x4 with a run scored, triple and an RBI and is batting .353 (6x17) with a double and two triples in four games during his rehab assignment. Granderson will continue the rehab assignment this evening at Single A West Michigan as the Whitecaps battle the Beloit Snappers at Fifth Third Ballpark. Granderson has been sidelined since March 23 with a non-displaced fracture of the third metacarpal in his right hand.

JUSTIN'S CASE: In his third full season at the major league level, Verlander will make his fifth start of the season tonight against the Texas Rangers.

OPENING DAY NOD: Verlander made the first Opening Day start of his major league career on March 31 against the Royals. He became the third different Tigers pitcher to start Opening Day during Jim Leyland's tenure as manager. Kenny Rogers started in 2006, while Jeremy Bonderman started in 2007.

RECEIVING SUPPORT FROM HIS TEAMMATES: In his 67 career starts at the major league level, Verlander has received 6.59 runs per nine innings of support. Since the start of the 2006 season, he is tops among all major league pitchers with 6.75 runs per nine innings of support.

RECORD AT COMERICA PARK: Verlander is making his 35th career start at Comerica Park this evening. In his previous 34 starts, he is 18-8 with a 3.80 ERA (210.2IP/89ER).

NO-NO: Verlander fired the first no-hitter in Comerica Park history on June 12, 2007 versus Milwaukee, the sixth no-hitter in Tigers history. It was the first no-hitter by a Tigers pitcher since Jack Morris on April 7, 1984 against the Chicago White Sox at Comiskey Park. Verlander became the first Tigers pitcher to toss a no-hitter in Detroit since Virgil Trucks on May 15, 1952 versus Washington at Briggs Stadium.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Verlander was selected by the Tigers in the first round (second overall) of the June 2004 draft. He was selected to the American League's all-star squad for the first time in 2007. Verlander was named the American League Rookie of the Year in 2006.
