RECENT RESULTS: Detroit's four-game winning streak was snapped with a 4-3 loss to the Angels last night at Comerica Park. Nate Robertson (0-3) took the loss for the Tigers after allowing four runs in seven innings. Curtis Granderson belted a solo home run for the Tigers, while Miguel Cabrera added a single and an RBI. Placido Polanco added a single and double for Detroit. The Tigers continue their six-game homestand with the second game of a three-game series against the Angels this afternoon. After an off day on Monday, the Tigers head out for a six-game road trip to New York and Minnesota.

RABURN TO BE HONORED BY DSBA: Prior to today's game, Ryan Raburn will receive his 2007 Tigers Rookie of the Year Award from the Detroit Sports Broadcasters Association.

WINNING WAYS: Detroit has won eight of the club's last 12 games despite suffering a 4-3 loss to the Angels last night. During the 12-game stretch dating back to April 14, Detroit is hitting .295 (122x414) with 89 runs scored, 29 doubles, three triples and 20 home runs. Detroit is leading all American League clubs with 89 runs scored, 20 home runs and a .524 slugging percentage during the stretch, while the club is second with a .295 batting average.

MAGLIO MASHES AGAINST ANGELS: Magglio Ordonez enters the game today against the Angels with a .324 batting average (95x293) in 75 games against the club, while he has collected 16 doubles, a triple, 21 home runs and 57 RBI. Ordonez is second among all active major league players with a .601 slugging percentage against the Angels, while he is fourth with a home run once every 13.95 at-bats and sixth with a .324 batting average.

BULLISH BEHAVIOR: Over the club's last eight games, Tigers relievers have compiled a 0.67 ERA (27.0IP/2ER). During the eight-game stretch, opposing batters have hit .156 (14x90) against club relievers. Detroit's bullpen has not been scored upon in its last 14.0 innings of work dating back to Tuesday night versus Texas.

WALK THIS WAY: The Tigers collected four walks last night against the Angels, and the club is leading the American League with 107 walks through its first 24 games of the season. The Tigers have drawn five-or-more walks 11 times so far in 2008. Detroit did not record its 11th five-or-walk game until June 1 during the 2007 season, the club's 54th game of the season.

RENTERIA'S RED HOT: Edgar Renteria has hit safely in 15 of his last 17 games dating back to April 9. During that stretch, Renteria is batting .394 (26x66) with 14 runs scored, five doubles, three home runs and 14 RBI. He is second in the American League with a .394 batting average during the stretch, while he is tied for second with 26 hits, fifth with a .606 slugging percentage and tied for eighth with 14 RBI.

HAPPY AT HOME: In 74 games at Comerica Park dating back to May 10, 2007, Magglio Ordonez is hitting .394 (110x279) with 62 runs scored, 25 doubles, 19 home runs and 70 RBI. He has reached base safely via a hit or walk in 67 of the games.

LOVING THE LONGBALL: Curtis Granderson belted his second home run of the season last night against the Angels and the Tigers have now homered in five straight games. During the five-game stretch, the Tigers have connected for 12 home runs. Additionally, the Tigers have homered in each of the club's last six games at Comerica Park. The Tigers have compiled a 9-5 record in the 14 games the club has homered this season.

FLASHING THE LEATHER: The Tigers have committed just one error in the club's last six games, a stretch of 228 total chances (.996 fielding percentage). Over the club's last 11 games, Detroit has compiled a .992 fielding percentage (398TC/3ER).

TV UPDATE: The Tigers game at New York on Tuesday night will be simulcast on FSN Detroit and FSN-PLUS until 10:00 p.m. At that time, FSN Detroit will shift to the Red Wings game, while the conclusion of the Tigers game will air on FSN-PLUS.

CRUCETA'S ASSIGNMENT TO TRIPLE A TOLEDO: Francisco Cruceta made his second appearance with Triple A Toledo last night at Columbus, earning the win as he fanned four batters in two innings of work. In his two outings with the Mud Hens, he is 1-0 with a 1.80 ERA (5.0IP/1ER) and 10 strikeouts. Cruceta was assigned to Toledo on April 22 and the assignment can last a maximum of 16 days. Cruceta was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on November 30, 2007.

ARMANDO'S ANTIDOTE: Galarraga will make his third start with the Tigers this afternoon against the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim. His contract was recalled from Triple A Toledo on April 16.

A FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING: In his second major league start on April 16 at Cleveland, Galarraga earned his first major league victory.

GOING FOR THREE: Galarraga takes the mound this afternoon against the Angels looking for his third straight win to begin his Tigers career. With a win today, Galarraga would be the first Tigers rookie pitcher to win each of his first three starts with the club since Kip Young won his first four starts for Detroit as a rookie July 24-August 9, 1978.

ROUGH ON THE RIGHTIES: Galarraga has held righthanded batters hitless (0x21) in his first two starts with the Tigers. In his two starts with Toledo, Galarraga limited righthanded batters to a .100 batting average (2x20).

RECORD AT COMERICA PARK: Galarraga is making his first career appearance at Comerica Park this evening.

VENEZUELAN HERITAGE: Galarraga is the eighth Venezuelan native to pitch in a game for the Tigers, joining Yorman Bazardo, Oscar Henriquez, Wilfredo Ledezma, Felipe Lira, Urbano Lugo, Ugueth Urbina and Lino Urdaneta. He is the fifth Venezuelan native to start a game for the Tigers, joining Bazardo, Ledezma, Lira and Lugo.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Galarraga was acquired by the Tigers from the Texas Rangers in a two-player deal on February 4, 2008. He originally signed with the Montreal Expos as a as a non-drafted free agent on October 31, 1998.
