RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers dropped their fourth straight game last night, falling 4-2 to the Cleveland Indians at Comerica Park. Justin Verlander (2-9) suffered the loss for Detroit after allowing three runs in seven innings of work. Jeff Larish and Brandon Inge both belted solo home for the Tigers, while Carlos Guillen added two hits. The Tigers continue a 10-game homestand this afternoon with the second game of a four-game series against the Indians. The White Sox and Dodgers both travel to Detroit for a three-game series each to conclude the homestand.

LOOKING FOR THE LEFTY: The Tigers face lefthanded pitcher Aaron Laffey this afternoon as they battle the Indians at Comerica Park. Since the start of the 2007 season, the Tigers have compiled a .292 batting average (491x1679) against lefthanded pitchers. Detroit leads the American League during this stretch with a .292 batting average and .475 slugging percentage against lefthanded pitching. Since the start of the 2007 season, the Tigers have posted a 35-19 record in games started by lefthanded pitchers.

HITTING THE TRIBE: Since the start of the 2007 season, the Tigers are hitting .288 (225x779) in 21 games against the Cleveland Indians. Detroit has scored 112 runs during the stretch, while collecting 54 doubles, five triples and 21 home runs.

GUILLEN ON THE OFFENSIVE VERSUS THE TRIBE: Since joining the Tigers in 2004, Carlos Guillen is hitting .348 (77x221) with 15 doubles, two triples, eight home runs and 31 RBI in 57 games. He is 11th among all active major league players with a .348 batting average against the Indians during the stretch.

ORDONEZ ON THE OFFENSIVE: Magglio Ordonez is batting .331 (51x154) with 24 runs scored, 10 doubles, seven home runs and 31 RBI over his last 41 games dating back to April 21. He is tied for fifth in the American League with 31 RBI during that stretch, while he is seventh with a .331 batting average and tied for ninth with 51 RBI. Ordonez collected his 10th multi-RBI game of the season on June 1 at Seattle and the Tigers improved to 10-0 when he drives in multiple runs.

POLANCO'S PRODUCTION: Placido Polanco is batting .333 (49x147) with 23 runs scored, 12 doubles, two home runs and 13 RBI over his last 36 games dating to April 25. Polanco is tied for fifth in the American League with 12 doubles during the stretch, while he is tied for sixth with 49 hits and seventh with a .333 batting average.

HAPPY AT HOME: In 89 games at Comerica Park dating back to May 10, 2007, Magglio Ordonez is hitting .396 (133x336) with 72 runs scored, 32 doubles, 22 home runs and 83 RBI. He has reached base safely via a hit or walk in 79 of the games.

SOLID STARTING: Tigers starting pitchers have combined to compile a 3.18 ERA (73.2IP/26ER) over the club's last 11 games. Opponents are hitting .241 (65x270) against club starters during the 11-game stretch.

RAPADA ASSIGNED TO TOLEDO ON INJURY REHAB: The Tigers today assigned lefthanded pitcher Clay Rapada to Triple A Toledo as part of an injury rehab assignment.

REHAB RUNDOWN: Righthanded pitchers Fernando Rodney and Joel Zumaya are both currently pitching as part of injury rehab assignments:

- Rodney was assigned to Triple A Toledo on Tuesday and he has appeared in two games with the Mud Hens. He has earned one win in his two outings, while he has allowed three runs in 2.1 innings pitched.
- Zumaya was assigned to Single A Lakeland on Tuesday and he has appeared in two games with the Flying Tigers. He has fanned two batters in three scoreless innings of relief.

CLEVEN, KIBLER EARN MINOR LEAGUE HONORS FOR MAY: Triple A Toledo outfielder Brent Clevlen and Single A West Michigan lefthanded pitcher Jon Kibler were selected the Tigers Minor League Player and Pitcher of the Month, respectively, for May. Clevlen batted .359 (37x103) with 18 runs scored, seven doubles, three triples, six home runs and 30 RBI in 29 games during the month. Clevlen finished third in the International League with 30 RBI during May, while he tied for third with a .359 batting average and tied for fifth with 68 total bases. Kibler compiled a 4-1 record, 1.49 ERA (36.1IP/6ER) and 35 strikeouts in five starts during the month. Kibler tied for second in the Midwest League with four wins during May, while he finished fourth with a 1.49 ERA and 35 strikeouts.

KUNKEL, STRIEBY ADDED TO FSL ALL-STAR SQUAD: Single A Lakeland catcher Jeff Kunkel and first baseman Ryan Strieby have been added to the Florida State League's mid-season all-star squad and will participate in the league's all-star game.

THE READ ON ROGERS: Rogers is making his 13th start of the season for the Tigers this afternoon against the Cleveland Indians.

MOVING UP THE ALL-TIME LEFTY LIST: Rogers is currently in 21st place on the all-time win list among lefthanded pitchers with his 214 career victories. With two more wins, he will match Wilbur Cooper for 20th on that all-time list.

AMONG THE ACTIVE LEADERS: Rogers enters his start this afternoon against the Indians among the active major league pitching leaders in numerous categories. He is seventh with 214 wins and 456 games started, while he is eighth with 3195.2 innings pitched and 11th with 1926 strikeouts.

FINE IN HIS LAST FOUR VERSUS THE TRIBE: Rogers has compiled a 2-0 record and 2.39 ERA (26.1IP/7ER) in his last four starts against the Indians dating back to August 5, 2006. He has posted three quality starts versus Cleveland during the stretch.

SIZING UP GRADY: Rogers has limited Grady Sizemore to a .172 batting average (5x29) thus far in his career. It is Sizemore's lowest batting average against all pitchers in which he has at least 20 plate appearances.

SOLID SUPPORT: Rogers is seventh in the American League with 5.94 runs per nine innings of support this season. Since joining the Tigers in 2006, he is seventh in the American League with 6.10 runs per nine innings of support.

RECORD AT COMERICA PARK: Rogers is making his 36th career appearance, 33rd start, this afternoon at Comerica Park. In his previous 35 outings, he is 15-7 with a 3.61 ERA (199.1IP/80ER).

NO SWIPING: Tony Pena's stolen base against Rogers in the third inning on May 15 at Kansas City was the first time an opponent attempted to steal against Rogers since Toronto's Gregg Zaun was caught stealing in the fourth inning on September 28, 2006. It was a stretch of 20 appearances (19 starts) without an opponent even attempting to steal against him. The last successful stolen base attempt against Rogers was by Boston's Coco Crisp on June 2, 2006 when he stole second base in the fourth inning. It was a stretch of 41 appearances (40 starts) without a stolen base against Rogers. During his Tigers career, opponents have been successful in two of the nine stolen base attempts (22.2 percent) and he has picked off five runners.

TOUGH ON THE LEFTIES: Lefthanded batters are hitting .218 (70x321) against Rogers since he joined the Tigers in 2006.

WINNING WAYS: Rogers is sixth among all active lefthanded pitchers with a .593 winning percentage during his major league career. The following is a list of the top 10 active lefthanded pitchers in the majors:
