RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers knocked off the Chicago White Sox 5-1 last night, the club's fourth win in its last five games. Justin Verlander (3-9) went the distance for the Tigers to earn the win. Marcus Thames belted a three-run home run for Detroit, while Curtis Granderson, Placido Polanco and Edgar Renteria all finished with two hits. The Tigers continue a 10-game homestand this afternoon with the final game of a three-game series against the White Sox. The Dodgers will be in Detroit for a three-game series this weekend to conclude the homestand.

LOOKING FOR THE LEFTY: The Tigers face lefthanded pitcher Mark Buehrle this afternoon as they battle the White Sox at Comerica Park. Since the start of the 2007 season, the Tigers have compiled a .292 batting average (511x1750) against lefthanded pitchers. Detroit leads the American League during this stretch with a .292 batting average and .473 slugging percentage against lefthanded pitching. Since the start of the 2007 season, the Tigers have posted a 37-20 record in games started by lefthanded pitchers.

ORDONEZ SWINGS HOT STICK AGAINST BUEHRLE: Magglio Ordonez enters today's game with a .600 batting average (15x25) during his career versus Mark Buehrle. Ordonez is tops among all active major league players with a minimum of 25 plate appearances against Buehrle with a .600 batting average.

GUILLEN GOING GREAT AGAINST SOX: Carlos Guillen is hitting .331 (115x347) with 17 doubles, nine triples, nine home runs and 54 RBI in 98 games during his career against the White Sox. He is fourth among all active major league players with a .331 batting average, while he is sixth with a .403 on-base percentage.

MAGGS MASHES AGAINST OLD 'MATES: Magglio Ordonez enters the game today against his old team, the Chicago White Sox, with a .322 batting average (66x205) in 54 games versus the club. He has collected 13 doubles, six home runs and 31 RBI during his career against the White Sox. Ordonez is eighth among all active major league players with a .322 batting average against the club.

HITTING AT HOME: The Tigers are third among all American League clubs with a .290 batting average (316x1091) in 32 games at home this season. Magglio Ordonez is tied for third in the league with a .371 batting average (46x124) at home, while Carlos Guillen is seventh with a .358 batting average (38x106) at home.

POLANCO'S PRODUCTION: Placido Polanco is batting .353 (60x170) with 27 runs scored, 14 doubles, two home runs and 14 RBI over his last 41 games dating to April 25. Polanco is tied for the lead in the American League with 14 doubles during the stretch, while he is second with 60 hits and third with a .353 batting average.

ORDONEZ ON THE OFFENSIVE: Magglio Ordonez is batting .329 (57x173) with 26 runs scored, 11 doubles, seven home runs and 33 RBI over his last 46 games dating back to April 21. He is sixth in the American League with 33 RBI during that stretch, while he is seventh with a .329 batting average and 10th with 57 hits. Ordonez collected his 10th multi-RBI game of the season on June 1 at Seattle and the Tigers improved to 10-0 when he drives in multiple runs.

HAPPY AT HOME: In 94 games at Comerica Park dating back to May 10, 2007, Magglio Ordonez is hitting .392 (139x355) with 74 runs scored, 33 doubles, 22 home runs and 85 RBI. He has reached base safely via a hit or walk in 84 of the games.

MINER ON A MISSION: Zach Miner is 3-2 with a 1.96 ERA (23.0IP/5ER) over his last 16 outings dating back to April 24. He has limited opponents to a .190 batting average (16x84) during the stretch.

REHAB RUNDOWN: Righthanded pitchers Fernando Rodney and Joel Zumaya are both currently pitching as part of injury rehab assignments:

- Rodney was assigned to Triple A Toledo on June 3 and he has appeared in two games with the Mud Hens. He has earned one win in his three outings, while he has fanned five batters and allowed four runs in 3.1 innings pitched.
- Zumaya was assigned to Single A Lakeland on June 3 and he appeared in two games with the Flying Tigers. He fanned two batters in three scoreless innings of relief with Lakeland, before having his rehab assignment transferred to Triple A Toledo on Sunday. He has appeared in two games with Toledo, allowing two runs (one earned) in two innings.

THE READ ON ROGERS: Rogers is making his 14th start of the season for the Tigers this afternoon against the Chicago White Sox.

MOVING UP THE ALL-TIME LEFTY LIST: Rogers is currently in 21st place on the all-time win list among lefthanded pitchers with his 214 career victories. With two more wins, he will match Wilbur Cooper for 20th on that all-time list.

AMONG THE ACTIVE LEADERS: Rogers enters his start this afternoon against the White Sox among the active major league pitching leaders in numerous categories. He is seventh with 214 wins and 457 games started, while he is eighth with 3202.2 innings pitched and 11th with 1929 strikeouts.

TERRIFIC IN HIS LAST THREE: Rogers has compiled a 1.29 ERA (21.0IP/3ER) over his last three starts, despite not factoring in the decision in any of the outings. Opponents are hitting .216 (16x74) with Rogers on the mound during the stretch.

TROUBLING THOME: Rogers has limited Jim Thome to a .184 batting average (9x49) when the two have matched up. Thome's .184 batting average is fourth-lowest against any active major league pitcher he has 30-or-more plate appearances against.

MR. JUNE: Since joining the Tigers in 2006, Rogers is 5-0 with a 2.74 ERA (65.2IP/20ER) in 10 starts during June. He is sixth in the American League with a 2.74 ERA in June during the stretch.

RECORD AT COMERICA PARK: Rogers is making his 37th career appearance, 34th start, this afternoon at Comerica Park. In his previous 36 outings, he is 15-7 with a 3.53 ERA (206.1IP/81ER).

NO SWIPING: Tony Pena's stolen base against Rogers in the third inning on May 15 at Kansas City was the first time an opponent attempted to steal against Rogers since Toronto's Gregg Zaun was caught stealing in the fourth inning on September 28, 2006. It was a stretch of 20 appearances (19 starts) without an opponent even attempting to steal against him. The last successful stolen base attempt against Rogers was by Boston's Coco Crisp on June 2, 2006 when he stole second base in the fourth inning. It was a stretch of 41 appearances (40 starts) without a stolen base against Rogers. During his Tigers career, opponents have been successful in two of the nine stolen base attempts (22.2 percent) and he has picked off five runners.

TOUGH ON THE LEFTIES: Lefthanded batters are hitting .219 (71x324) against Rogers since he joined the Tigers in 2006.

WINNING WAYS: Rogers is seventh among all active lefthanded pitchers with a .593 winning percentage during his major league career. The following is a list of the top 10 active lefthanded pitchers in the majors:
