**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers suffered an 8-6 loss to the San Francisco Giants last night, snapping the club's six-game winning streak. Freddy Dolsi (0-2) took the loss for the Tigers after allowing two runs in relief. Marcus Thames belted two home runs and drove in three runs for Detroit, while Ivan Rodriguez added three hits. Curtis Granderson singled and drove in two runs for the Tigers. The Tigers continue a six-game road trip this evening with the second game of a three-game series at San Francisco. Following an off day on Thursday, the club concludes the trip with a three-game series at San Diego beginning on Friday night.

**INTERLEAGUE HAPPENINGS:** Tonight's contest against the Giants is Detroit's eighth game of interleague play in 2008. Since interleague play was started in 1997, the Tigers have compiled a 104-96 record. The Tigers are 45-30 in interleague games at Comerica Park. The Tigers are 4-3 during interleague action in 2008. Since the start of the 2006 season, Detroit has compiled a 33-10 record during interleague action.

**INTERLEAGUE LEADERS:** Four Tigers players are among the top 16 active major league players in batting average during interleague play: Magglio Ordonez is second with a .341 batting average (185x542), Ivan Rodriguez is 13th with a .318 batting average (221x694), Placido Polanco is 14th with a .317 batting average (157x495) and Edgar Renteria is 16th with a .316 batting average (209x661).

**IT STARTS WITH PITCHING:** Over the club's last 21 games, Detroit's starting pitching has combined to post a 3.26 ERA (135.1IP/49ER). During the 21-game stretch, Tigers starters have posted 14 quality starts and limited opponents to a .230 batting average (114x495).

**CABRERA, RENTERIA ENJOY SUCCESS AT AT&T PARK:** Miguel Cabrera and Edgar Renteria both have hit well during their careers at AT&T Park. In 17 games at the park, Cabrera is batting .333 (21x63) with three doubles, six home runs and 16 RBI. Renteria is hitting .360 (31x86) in 21 games during his career at AT&T Park, collecting six doubles, three home runs and 14 RBI.

**POLANCO'S PRODUCTION:** Placido Polanco is batting .353 (66x187) with 28 runs scored, 14 doubles, two home runs and 18 RBI over his last 45 games dating back to April 25. Polanco is tied for the lead in the American League with 66 hits during the stretch, while he is third with a .353 batting average and tied for fourth with 14 doubles.

**RENERIA CLOSING IN ON 2,000 HITS:** After collecting two hits on Sunday versus the Dodgers, Edgar Renteria enters tonight's game one hit shy of 2,000 in his major league career. He would become the first native of Colombia to reach the 2,000-hit plateau.

**MARCUS MASHES LONGBALLS:** Marcus Thames belted two home runs last night at San Francisco and he has now homered in each of his last four games. He is third among all American League players with at least 1,000 plate appearances since the start of the 2004 season with a home run once every 13.73 at-bats (1002AB/73HR). During his Tigers career, the club has posted a 48-19 record when Thames hits a home run (including 9-1 in 2008).

**MORE MARCUS:** Marcus Thames is the first Tigers player to belt a home run in four straight games since Magglio Ordonez did so May 5-9, 2006. The Tigers record for most consecutive games with a home run is five, held by Rudy York (1937), Hank Greenberg (1940), Vic Wertz (1950) and Willie Horton (1969). Thames has connected for seven home runs over his last nine games dating back to June 7. He is tops among all major league players with the seven home runs during that stretch.

**REHAB RUNDOWN:** Righthanded pitcher Joel Zumaya and outfielders Gary Sheffield and Clete Thomas are all currently playing with Tigers minor league affiliates as part of injury rehab assignments:

- Zumaya was assigned to Single A Lakeland on June 3 and he appeared in two games with the Flying Tigers. He fanned two batters in three scoreless innings of relief with Lakeland, before having his rehab assignment transferred to Triple A Toledo on June 8. He has appeared in four games with Toledo, allowing three runs (one earned) in four innings.
- Sheffield was assigned to Single A Lakeland yesterday and he was hitless in two at-bats with a walk in his first game with the Flying Tigers.
- Thomas was assigned to Triple A Toledo on June 13 and he is hitting .286 (4x14) with a double, home run and four RBI in his first four games with the Mud Hens.

**CHRISTENSEN TABBED EL PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Double A Erie lefthanded pitcher Danny Christensen was selected the Eastern League Pitcher of the Week for June 9-15. In two starts during the week, Christensen posted a 1-0 record, 1.29 ERA (14.0IP/2ER) and 12 strikeouts.

## TONIGHT'S TIGERS STARTER - KENNY ROGERS

**THE READ ON ROGERS:** Rogers is making his 15th start of the season for the Tigers this evening against the San Francisco Giants.

**FINE IN HIS LAST FOUR:** Rogers has compiled a 0.93 ERA (29.0IP/3ER) over his last four starts, despite not factoring in the decision in any of the outings. Opponents are hitting .200 (20x100) with Rogers on the mound during the stretch.

**MR. JUNE:** Since joining the Tigers in 2006, Rogers is 5-0 with a 2.44 ERA (73.2IP/20ER) in 11 starts during June. He is second in the American League with a 2.44 ERA in June during the stretch.

**INTERLEAGUE ACTION:** Rogers is making his 39th appearance, 38th start, during interleague play this evening. In his previous 38 outings, he is 15-6 with a 3.96 ERA (236.1IP/104ER).

**MOVING UP THE ALL-TIME LEFTY LIST:** Rogers is currently in 21st place on the all-time win list among lefthanded pitchers with his 214 career victories. With two more wins, he will match Wilbur Cooper for 20th on that all-time list.

**AMONG THE ACTIVE LEADERS:** Rogers enters his start this evening against the Giants among the active major league pitching leaders in numerous categories. He is seventh with 214 wins and 458 games started, while he is eighth with 3210.2 innings pitched and 11th with 1930 strikeouts.

**AT THE PLATE:** Rogers is hitting .138 (9x65) with a double, triple and four RBI during his major league career. He has collected four sacrifice bunts, while walking four times and fanning 24 times. Rogers' last hit came on June 18, 2006 at Wrigley Field against the Cubs, a double in the eighth inning off Roberto Novoa.

**RECORD AT AT&T PARK:** Rogers is making his first career start at AT&T Park this evening. AT&T Park will mark the 38th different park Rogers has pitched in during his major league career.

**NO SWIPING:** Tony Pena's stolen base against Rogers in the third inning on May 15 at Kansas City was the first time an opponent attempted to steal against Rogers since Toronto's Gregg Zaun was caught stealing in the fourth inning on September 28, 2006. It was a stretch of 20 appearances (19 starts) without an opponent even attempting to steal against him. The last successful stolen base attempt against Rogers was by Boston's Coco Crisp on June 2, 2006 when he stole second base in the fourth inning. It was a stretch of 41 appearances (40 starts) without a stolen base against Rogers. During his Tigers career, opponents have been successful in two of the nine stolen base attempts (22.2 percent) and he has picked off five runners.

**TOUGH ON THE LEFTIES:** Lefthanded batters are hitting .219 (71x324) against Rogers since he joined the Tigers in 2006.

**WINNING WAYS:** Rogers is seventh among all active lefthanded pitchers with a .593 winning percentage during his major league career. The following is a list of the top 10 active lefthanded pitchers in the majors:
