**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers knocked off the Brewers 9-5 yesterday at Comerica Park, the club's third straight win. Alfredo Figaro (1-0) fanned seven batters as he limited the Brewers to two runs in five innings of work to earn the win in his major league debut. Miguel Cabrera, Marcus Thames, Don Kelly and Josh Anderson all collected three hits for the Tigers. Cabrera and Placido Polanco both connected for a home run in the win. The Tigers continue a six-game homestand with the final game of a three-game series versus the Brewers this afternoon. Following an off day tomorrow, the club begins a three-game series against the Chicago Cubs on Tuesday.

**INTERLEAGUE HAPPENINGS:** Today's contest against the Brewers is Detroit's 12th game of interleague play in 2009. Since interleague play was started in 1997, the Tigers have compiled a 118-104 record. The Tigers are 53-33 in interleague games at Comerica Park. The Tigers are 5-6 during interleague action in 2009.

**AMONG THE BEST SINCE 2006:** The Tigers have compiled a 47-18 record during interleague play since the start of the 2006 season. The 47 wins and .723 winning percentage during interleague action are second-best among all major league clubs during that stretch. The Minnesota Twins have compiled a 49-16 record and .754 winning percentage during that stretch, the only club better than the Tigers.

**HOME IS WHERE THE MOUND IS:** In 30 games at Comerica Park this season, Tigers pitchers have compiled a 3.63 ERA (268.0IP/108ER). The Tigers are tops among all American League clubs with a .240 batting average against (241x1005) at home in 2009, while the team is second with a 3.63 ERA.

**ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT:** Alfredo Figaro earned the win for the Tigers yesterday as he started in his major league debut versus Milwaukee. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Figaro was the 29th major league pitcher this season to make his major league debut as a starting pitcher. Those pitchers are 12-7 (with 10 no-decisions) in the 29 starts.

**THE LINE ON LYON:** Brandon Lyon allowed one run in two innings against the Brewers yesterday, snapping his scoreless streak at 13.0 innings. Over his last 13 outings, Lyon has compiled a 1-0 record, 1.86 ERA (19.1IP/4ER) and 14 strikeouts.

**POLANCO PACKS A PUNCH:** Placido Polanco is hitting .333 (17x51) over his last 15 games for the Tigers. He is hitting .326 (186x571) in 147 games during his career in interleague action, 11th-best among all active major league players.

**POP FROM THE TOP OF THE ORDER:** Tigers lead-off hitters have combined for 17 home runs this season, second-most among all American League clubs. The club is second in the league with a .493 slugging percentage from the top spot in the order, while it is third with 29 extra-base hits.

**RODNEY CONVERTS:** Fernando Rodney converted his 13th save in as many chances on Thursday at St. Louis. It marks the longest such streak during a single season by a Tigers pitcher since Todd Jones converted his first 14 save opportunities April 11-June 22, 2008.

**DAYTIME DELIGHT:** The Tigers enter this afternoon's contest versus Milwaukee with a 17-7 record in the club's 24 day games thus far in 2009. The team is hitting .294 (240x815) with 147 runs scored, 37 doubles, six triples and 24 home runs in 24 games during the day this season. The Tigers are tops among all American League clubs with a .294 batting average in day games this season. Club pitchers are second in the league with a 3.65 ERA (212.0IP/86ER) during day games this season.

**LOVING THE LONGBALL:** The Tigers are tied for the American League lead with 22 home runs since June 7. Detroit has homered at least twice in each of the club's last five games, the longest such stretch since doing so in five straight games June 13-17, 2008.

**MARCUS MASHES:** Marcus Thames has hit safely in 11 of his 14 games for the Tigers since being activated from the disabled list on June 7, hitting .366 (15x41) with five home runs. Since joining the Tigers in 2004, he has homered once every 13.89 at-bats (1264AB/91HR) in 418 games. Thames is third among all American League players with a minimum of 1,000 plate appearances since the start of the 2006 season with a home run once every 13.41 at-bats (992AB/74HR) in 319 games.

**BASES LOADED BONANZA:** Detroit is tops among all American League clubs with a .429 batting average (27x63) when hitting with the bases loaded this season. Detroit is leading all league clubs with five grand slams and 79 RBI with the bases loaded.

**INJURY UPDATE:** RHP **Jeremy Bonderman** (continued rehabilitation from thoracic outlet compression syndrome surgery, 15-day DL on June 9), OF **Carlos Guillen** (right shoulder inflammation, 15-day DL on May 5), C **Matt Treanor** (right hip strain, 60-day DL on April 24), LHP **Dontrelle Willis** (anxiety disorder, 15-day DL on June 15).

## TODAY'S TIGERS STARTER - JUSTIN VERLANDER

'09 Season (Detroit): 7-3, 3.39 ERA, 14 G, 14 GS, 2 CG, 1 SHO, 0 SV, 90.1 IP, 78 H, 37 R, 34 ER, 27 BB, 110 SO.

**JUSTIN'S CASE:** In his fourth full season at the major league level, Verlander will make his 15th start of the season today against the Brewers.

**LOOKING AT THE LEADER BOARDS:** Verlander is tops among all American League pitchers with 110 strikeouts and 11.0 strikeouts per nine innings, while he is fifth with 4.07 strikeouts per walk, tied for seventh with seven wins, eighth with a .234 batting average against and 7.77 hits per nine innings and ninth with 10.76 baserunners per nine innings.

**WE MEET AGAIN:** Verlander is making his second career start against the Brewers this afternoon. In his first outing against the Brewers, Verlander fired the first no-hitter in Comerica Park history on June 12, 2007, the sixth no-hitter in Tigers history. It was the first no-hitter by a Tigers pitcher since Jack Morris on April 7, 1984 against the Chicago White Sox at Comiskey Park.

**INTERLEAGUE ACTION:** Verlander is making his 12th career start during interleague play this afternoon against the Brewers. In his previous 11 outings during interleague play, he is 8-1 with a 2.80 ERA (70.2IP/22ER) and 75 strikeouts. Verlander is tied for fourth among all active major league pitchers since the start of the 2006 season with eight wins during interleague play, while he is ninth with a 2.80 ERA and tied for 10th with 75 strikeouts.

**AMONG THE AL BEST SINCE 2006:** Verlander is third among American League pitchers with 53 wins since the start of the 2006 season, while he is tied for third with 109 starts, fourth with 679.0 innings pitched and sixth with 580 strikeouts.

**WINNING AT HOME:** Verlander is second among all active American League pitchers with 28 wins at home since the start of the 2006 season. He has compiled a 28-14 record in his 53 starts at home during the stretch, a .667 winning percentage. Only Toronto's Roy Halladay (35) has posted more wins at home during the stretch.

**HOME COOKIN':** Verlander is 3-0 with a 0.82 ERA (33.0IP/3ER) with five starts at home this season. Verlander is tops among all American League pitchers with a 0.82 ERA at home this season.

**RECORD AT COMERICA PARK:** Verlander is making his 56th career start at Comerica Park this afternoon. In his previous 55 outings, he is 28-15 with a 3.77 ERA (337.0IP/141ER).

**ROUGH ON THE RIGHTIES:** Verlander has limited righthanded batters to a .194 batting average (28x144) this season, while lefthanded batters are hitting .263 (50x190) against him. He is fifth among all American League pitchers with a .194 batting average against righthanded batters.

**MATCHING LOLICH:** Justin Verlander fanned nine batters on June 10 at Chicago as he went the distance to earn the win, bringing his season total to 106 strikeouts in 13 starts. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Verlander tied the franchise record for the fewest games to reach 100 strikeouts in a season, matching Mickey Lolich in 1969. Lolich fanned 103 batters in his first 13 outings (12 starts) of the 1969 season.

**SEVEN-GAME WINNING STREAK:** Verlander won seven straight decisions April 27-June 10, matching his career-best winning streak. He also won seven straight for the Tigers June 17-August 1, 2006.

**QUALITY STREAK:** Verlander recorded a quality start in nine straight outings for the Tigers April 27-June 10. It was the longest such streak by a Tigers pitcher since Justin Thompson also registered a quality start in nine straight July 26-September 5, 1997. Verlander is tied for 11th in the American League with nine quality starts this season.

**VERLANDER EARNS AMERICAN LEAGUE PITCHER OF THE MONTH HONORS:** Verlander was named the American League's Pitcher of the Month for May by Major League Baseball. He finished 5-0 with a 1.52 ERA (41.1IP/7ER) and 56 strikeouts in six starts during the month. Verlander led the league with 56 strikeouts during the month, while he tied for the lead with five wins and finished second with a 1.52 ERA. He is the first Tigers pitcher to win the award since Steve Sparks did so in August of 2000.

**MORE ABOUT JUSTIN'S MAGNIFICENT MAY:** According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Verlander became the first major league pitcher to go undefeated in a month of five-or-more decisions with as many as 56 strikeouts since Pedro Martinez did so with Boston in July of 2002. Martinez went 5-0 with 59 strikeouts in 42.1 innings for the Red Sox that month. Jack Morris is the only other Tigers pitcher ever to have a month with such numbers as he went 6-0 with 56 strikeouts in 54.0 innings in August of 1983.

**VERLANDER RINGS UP 60 IN SIX STARTS:** Verlander fanned 60 batters over a six-start stretch April 27-May 25. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the third Tigers pitcher to accomplish the feat, joining Mickey Lolich (1969 and 1971) and Denny McLain (twice in 1968). Lolich holds the club record with 62 strikeouts over a six-start stretch May 23-June 25, 1969.

**RING 'EM UP:** Verlander established a career high with 13 strikeouts on May 14 at Minnesota, his third straight start with 10-or-more strikeouts. He is the first Tigers pitcher since Mickey Lolich to fan 10-or-more batters in three straight starts. Lolich accomplished the feat twice in 1971, with the second stretch coming July 27-August 4. Verlander is only the third Tigers pitcher since at least 1954 to fan 10-or-more batters in three straight starts. It marks the fifth time overall a Tigers pitcher has done so since at least 1954, with Lolich accomplishing the feat three times (once in 1964, twice in 1971) and Denny McLain pulled off the feat in 1968. Verlander has fanned 10-or-more batters in a start seven times during his major league career.

**VERLANDER AND LOLICH AGAIN:** With a career-high 13 strikeouts on May 14 at Minnesota, Verlander fanned 35 batters over a three-start stretch. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Verlander joins Mickey Lolich as the only two pitchers in Tigers history with as many strikeouts over a three-start stretch. Lolich fanned 38 batters over a three-start stretch July 27-August 4, 1971 and he struck out 36 batters over a three-start stretch May 23-June 9, 1969.

**MISCELLANEOUS NOTES:** Verlander was selected by the Tigers in the first round (second overall) of the June 2004 draft. He was selected to the American League's all-star squad for the first time in 2007. Verlander was named the American League Rookie of the Year in 2006.
