**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers lost 5-1 to the Oakland Athletics on Wednesday afternoon. Justin Verlander (8-4) allowed four runs on six hits in six innings of work to take the loss. Adam Everett led the Tigers with a pair of hits, including a double, while Miguel Cabrera, Don Kelly and Gerald Laird all finished with doubles in the loss. The club continues a nine-game road trip tonight with the first game of a three-game series against the Minnesota Twins at the Metrodome. The club begins a six-game homestand on Monday with a three-game series against the Kansas City Royals.

**INGE, VERLANDER EARN JUNE HONORS:** Brandon Inge and Justin Verlander were selected the Tigers Player and Pitcher of the Month, respectively, for June. Inge hit .287 (27x94) with three doubles, a triple, six home runs and 19 RBI in 28 games during June. Verlander compiled a 2-1 record and 2.91 ERA (34.0IP/11ER) in five starts during June.

**GRANDY SLUGS VERSUS THE TWINS:** Curtis Granderson is batting .294 (73x248) with 15 doubles, six triples, 14 home runs and 34 RBI in 68 games during his career against the Minnesota Twins. He enters tonight's game eighth among all active major league players with a .573 slugging percentage versus the Twins. Granderson is hitting .320 (40x125) with eight doubles, two triples, seven home runs and 16 RBI in 34 games during his career at the Metrodome. He is fifth among all active major league players with a .584 slugging percentage at the Metrodome and ninth with a .320 batting average.

**RABURN ON A ROLL:** Ryan Raburn is hitting .312 (24x77) with 17 runs scored, six doubles, five home runs and 18 RBI in his last 32 games. He is hitting .394 (13x33) with three doubles, four home runs and 14 RBI against lefthanded pitchers during that stretch.

**HOMERING IN THE METRODOME:** The Tigers clubbed three home runs on May 13 against the Twins in the Metrodome and have homered in 11 of the club's 13 games at the park dating back to September 16, 2007, for a total of 18 home runs. The Tigers have connected for 12 home runs over the team's last six games at the Metrodome.

**METRODOME VICTORIES:** Since the start of the 2007 season, the Tigers have compiled an 11-10 record against the Twins at the Metrodome. The 11 wins during that stretch are the most in the majors by a visiting club at the Metrodome.

**GRANDY GOES DEEP ON THE ROAD:** Curtis Granderson has belted 12 of his 18 home runs this season on the road and is tied with Boston's Jason Bay for the American League lead in road round trippers. Additionally, Granderson is seventh in the league with a home run once every 14.0 at-bats (168AB/12HR) and 11th with a .536 slugging percentage.

**CABRERA CRANKING IT UP:** Miguel Cabrera finished with a double on Wednesday afternoon at Oakland and has now hit safely in 12 of his last 15 games. He has collected multiple hits in nine of the games and is batting .373 (22x59) with 12 runs scored, five doubles, five home runs and eight RBI during that stretch. He is third in the American League with a .331 batting average this season, while he is seventh with a .395 on-base percentage, tied for eighth with 94 hits and ninth with a .556 slugging percentage.

**BRANDON BELTS LONGBALLS ON THE ROAD:** Brandon Inge has hit 11 of his 18 home runs this season on the road and is tied for third in the American League in road round trippers. He is sixth in the league with a home run once every 13.91 at-bats (153AB/11HR) and 10th with a .536 slugging percentage.

**POLANCO TIED WITH EDDIE MAYO FOR SEVENTH IN GAMES AT SECOND:** Placido Polanco enters tonight's game at Minnesota with 544 games played at second base with the Detroit Tigers. He is currently tied with Eddie Mayo for seventh place on the club's all-time list.

**RODNEY CONVERTS:** Fernando Rodney converted his 17th save in as many chances on Sunday afternoon against the Astros. It marks the longest streak during a single season by a Tigers pitcher since Todd Jones converted 19 straight June 10-August 30, 2006.

**JULY 26TH GAME SELECTED TO ESPN SUNDAY NIGHT BASEBALL:** The Tigers game on July 26th against the Chicago White Sox at Comerica Park has been selected for ESPN Sunday Night Baseball and the game time will be moved from 1:05 p.m. to 8:09 p.m.

**RADIO UPDATE:** Dan Dickerson has not been cleared to travel with the club following his injury, so FOX Sports Detroit pre-game show host John Keating will join Jim Price in the Tigers radio booth for all nine games on the club's current road trip.

**FIVE NAMED TO EASTERN LEAGUE ALL-STAR SQUAD:** Double A Erie righthanded pitcher Josh Rainwater, catcher Alex Avila, first baseman Ryan Strieby and outfielders Brennan Boesch and Deik Scram have all been selected to the Eastern League's mid-season all-star squad.
