THE FISH: Today marks the third of a nine-game, 10-day homestand against the Twins (1-1), Pirates (3g) and Braves (3g). The Fish went 3-3 on their last trip to Kansas City (1-2) and Chicago-AL (2-1). They went 2-4 on their last homestand against Tampa Bay (1-2) and Cleveland (1-2). After this homestand, the Fish will start a seven-day trip to San Diego (July 2-5) and Los Angeles-NL (July 6-8), then they will have a four-day All-Star Break from July 9-12.

AGAINST THE TWINS: The Marlins and Twins play the final of a three-game series at Dolphin Stadium, marking the Twins' first-ever regular-season trip to Miami. The teams had met just once before this series, from June 7-9, 2004, in Minnesota. The Fish went 1-2 in that series.

YESTERDAY: The Marlins lost 11-1 to the Twins at Dolphin Stadium. RHP Josh Johnson (0-2) took the loss, allowing 7 ER in 3.0 innings. Hanley Ramirez, Mike Jacobs and Miguel Olivo each had two hits for the Fish.

BAD TO THE BOONE: Aaron Boone did not play last night, after starting the previous 23g dating back to May 29 at Chicago-NL. **He has hit in the last 8g**, batting .429 (12x28), 4 RBI over that stretch. His career-long hit streak is 9g (6x, last June 30-July 9, 2006).

MOVIN' ON UP: With his 2 HR Saturday at KC, Miguel Cabrera now has 120 HR for his career, tied with Jeff Conine for fourth on the Marlins' All-Time HR list. He needs 2 HR to move into a third-place tie with Gary Sheffield (122).

LEFT HOOK: The Marlins will face LH starting pitchers in the next 2g and three of the next 4g. Hanley Ramirez (.417/ 30x72) and Miguel Cabrera (.414/ 24x58) are first and second in the NL when batting against LHP. The Fish have a team average of .288 vs. LHP, second in the NL (fifth in MLB) behind the Mets (.302).

TRIPLE CROWN: Miguel Cabrera leads the Fish in batting average, home runs and RBI. He is one of just four Major League players who leads his club in all three Triple Crown categories:

EXTRA EFFORT: Florida has recorded at least one extra-base hit in all but two games this season. They lead the NL with 262 extra-base hits, second in MLB behind the Tigers (291). Dan Uggla and Matt Holliday are tied for the NL lead with 44 XBH, tied with Curtis Granderson for third-most in MLB behind Magglio Ordonez (47) and Alex Rodriguez (45).

DOUBLE TIME: Dan Uggla has 28 doubles, second in the NL behind Chase Utley (30) and third in the Majors: Magglio Ordonez (34) and Utley. **He needs just 3 doubles to match the Marlins record for doubles before the All-Star Break, established by Mike Lowell (31) in 2002.**

GREGG THE HAMMER: Kevin Gregg has converted all 14 save opps this year. He is one of just two pitchers this season that has 10+ saves and no blown saves: also J.J. Putz (20x20). The Marlins' record for most consecutive saves converted is 27, established by Todd Jones in 2005.

HAMMER TIME: Josh Willingham has batted 164 points higher and has 41 more RBI in Marlins' wins than he does in Marlins' losses. The Fish are 9-0 when he homers, and 44 of his 47 RBI have come in wins:

IRONMAN: Dan Uggla is the only Marlins player who has appeared in all 75 games this season. Only three Marlins (5x) have ever played 162g in a season: Juan Pierre (3x, 2003-05), Jeff Conine (1993), Derrek Lee (2002). Two Marlins have played in every game during a season with fewer than 162g: Preston Wilson (161g in 2000), Jeff Conine (115g in 1994).

TAKE ONE FOR THE TEAM: Aaron Boone has been hit by pitches a career-high 13 times this season, second-most in the Majors behind Chase Utley (15). The Marlins' single-season record is 17 HB, established by Carlos Delgado in 2005.

ON THE DL: The Marlins have six players on the DL: RH Jose Garcia (elbow inflammation) and RH Logan Kensing (Tommy John Surgery), both retro to March 23. OF Alejandro De Aza (retro 4/16) with a sprained right ankle. OF Cody Ross went on May 6 with a left hamstring strain. RHP Ricky Nolasco went on May 19 (retro 5/18) with right elbow inflammation. RHP Henry Owens went on 6/13 (retro 6/9) with rt. shoulder inflammation.

RADIO PINCH-HIT: Roxy Bernstein will call this weekend's games on WQAM 560 AM with Jesse Agler, who is filling in while Dave Van Horne attends to personal matters. Agler usually serves as pregame and post-game host for Marlins radio broadcasts.

RATINGS WAR: FSN is reporting a 57% increase in viewers watching Marlins games this season, compared to last season. Through 50g, the Fish averaged a 3.3 rating (2.1 in '06) on FSN Florida.

ALL-STAR FUTURES GAME: Two players in the Marlins' organization have been selected to participate in the XM All-Star Futures Game on July 8 (4 pm) at AT&T Park in San Francisco. **RHP Rick Vanden Hurk** will play on the World Team, and **INF Chris Coghlan** will play for the U.S. Team.

UP NEXT, THE PIRATES: The Marlins and Pirates begin a three-game series Tuesday at Dolphin Stadium. The teams split a four-game set in Pittsburgh from May 14-17. The Fish are 56-67 (33-24 home) all-time against the Bucs, including 2-2 (0-0 home) this season. The Marlins have won their last 3g and are 13-5 the last 18x the teams have met in Miami.

INTERLEAGUE NOTE: The Marlins are 9-8 (3-5 home) this season and are 105-80 (58-36 home) all-time against the AL. Their .568 win % in Interleague is tops among NL teams, third-best in MLB:

KIM HIGHLIGHTS

• Kim is making his seventh start, eight appearance, since being acquired by the Marlins from Colorado in exchange for Jorge Julio. The Marlins have won four of his six starts this season.

• Kim's last outing, June 18 at Chicago (AL), came in relief of starter Josh Johnson. Kim allowed two runs on four hits in 2.2 innings. This marked Kim's first bullpen appearance for the Marlins this season, third overall. Kim's last start came on June 13 vs. Cleveland, when Kim allowed four runs on four hits in 5.2 innings. He received the loss that day, his first as a Marlin.

• Kim has three appearances at Dolphin Stadium this season, compiling an 0-1 record and a 7.24 ERA. In his career, Kim has gone 2-2 in Miami with a 4.85 ERA in 11 appearances, four starts.

• Despite his 87 career appearances against an American League opponent, Kim has never faced the Twins. Minnesota is the only team in the Majors that Kim does never faced.

• Tonight's start will be the eighth of the season and the 73rd career start for the 28-year-old right-hander. This will be his 377th career game. Kim has appeared in more Major League games than any other South Korea-born player. Former Marlin Hee-Seop Choi, who is currently in Tampa Bay's minor league system is second on the list, followed by Chan Ho Park (HOU). Below is a chart of Korea-born players with Major League appearances:

• Kim has made three appearances out of the bullpen this season compiling a 1-1 record and a 6.35 ERA. Two of those appearances were with Colorado. As a starter Kim is 2-2 with a 5.03 ERA in 34.0 innings pitched.

• From April 22 – May 12 Kim compiled a 1-1 record with a 2.96 ERA while on a rehab assignment with the Colorado Springs Sky Sox (AAA). In five starts (24.1 IP) Kim struck out 31 batters while walking 11. Opponents hit .233 off him in those starts.

• After returning from an injury in late April 2006, Kim was the Rockies' fifth starter for the remainder of the year, going 8-12 with a 5.57 ERA in 27 games for Colorado. He set career highs in starts (27), innings (155.0), and strikeouts (129).

• Kim is yet to record a hit this season in eight at bats. He does have three sacrifice hits on the season, ranking third on the staff behind Willis (6) and Olsen (4).

Paul Maholm enters Tuesday's game with 10 losses trailing only Kip Wells (STL) in that category with 11. Maholm's 10 losses on the season could be attributed to his league worst run support average. When Maholm takes the hill the Pirates score 2.85 runs a game immediately lower than Doug Davis with Arizona (3.12). In his last outing, June 20 at Seattle, Maholm allowed six runs, four earned, in 7.0 innings of work. This marked Maholm's fifth time in his last six games to at least pitch into the seventh inning. Maholm has two career starts against the Marlins, including one this year on May 15 in Pittsburgh. Maholm allowed five runs on seven hits en route to receiving the loss.

Originally scheduled to start today vs. the Twins, Willis has been pushed back to Tuesday, due to tightness in his left forearm. His injury hampered his last start, as Willis completed 1.0 inning, allowing four runs on three hits and three walks. This tied Willis' shortest start of his career, the last coming on April 30, 2004, at San Francisco. Despite Willis' early exit the Marlins beat the White Sox 7-5 behind 3.2 innings of relief from Wes Obermueller. Willis has seven career starts against the Pirates, the last coming May 14, 2007, in Pittsburgh. Willis allowed two runs on six hits in 6.0 innings on his way to receiving the loss.
