COLORADO ROCKIES (90-73) vs PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (89-73)

JEFF FRANCIS (17-9, 4.22) vs COLE HAMELS (15-5, 3.39)

2007 SEASON RECAP: The Phillies won the National League East Division Championship after going 13-4 in their final 17 games ... The team got off to a 4-11 record in their first 15 games of the season and then went 85-62 the rest of the way, which was the best record in the NL from April 21 through the remainder of the season ... Going into the final day of the season, the Phillies and Mets were tied for the division lead ... The Phillies beat the Nationals, 5-1, and the Mets lost to the Marlins, 8-1.

PHILLIES POST-SEASON SUMMARY: For the tenth time in franchise history, the Phillies have reached the post-season (including the 1981 NLDS) ... 2007 snaps the Phillies' 14-year absence in Major League Baseball's playoffs ... In their history, the Phillies have one World Championship (1980), five NL pennants (1915, 1950, 1980, 1983 and 1993) and seven NL East titles (1976-78, 1980, 1983, 1993 and 2007) ... Today's game marks the Phillies' first playoff game since October 23, 1993, when they lost Game 6 of the World Series to the Toronto Blue Jays ... Today marks the first playoff game at Citizens Bank Park.

4-FOR-4: The Phillies have reached the playoffs in four consecutive decades: 1970's, 1980's, 1990's and 2000's ... They join the Mets, Dodgers and Giants as the only four National League clubs to have reached the post-season in each of the last four decades.

BEEN THERE, DONE THAT: Nine Phillies have participated in post-season play: Antonio Alfonseca, Rod Barajas, Tom Gordon, Tadahito Iguchi, Jose Mesa, Jamie Moyer, Abraham Nunez, J.C. Romero and Aaron Rowand ... Four have won World Championships: Alfonseca (1997 Marlins), Barajas (2001 Diamondbacks), Iguchi (2005 White Sox) and Rowand (2005 White Sox) and one other has appeared in a World Series: Mesa (1995 & 1997 Indians) ... Of the Phillies' coaching staff, five have managed, coached or played in the playoffs: Charlie Manuel, Davey Lopes, Steve Smith, Milt Thompson and Jimmy Williams.

GHOSTS OF PHILLIES PAST: Several members of the last two Phillies teams that went to the playoffs - 1993 and 1983 - currently work for the organization: broadcasters Larry Andersen (83 & 93) and Gary Matthews (83) ... hitting coach Milt Thompson (93) ... Assistant General Manager Ruben Amaro Jr. (93) ... minor league hitting coach Greg Gross (83) ... spring training instructor Mike Schmidt (83).

PHARM PRODUCE: Nine members of the Phillies' playoff roster were originally drafted or signed by the club ... They are: OF Michael Bourn, LF Pat Burrell, LHP Cole Hamels, 1B Ryan Howard, RHP Kyle Kendrick, RHP Brett Myers, C Carlos Ruiz, SS Jimmy Rollins and 2B Chase Utley ... Four of them are 1st rounders (Burrell, 1998; Myers, 1999; Utley, 2000; Hamels, 2002) and one is a 2nd rounder (Rollins, 1996).

ABOUT THE MANAGER: The Phillies are the 2nd team that manager Charlie Manuel has led to the playoffs, both winning division titles ... He managed the Indians to the American League Central Division Championship in 2001 (91-71) ... His career major league managerial record stands at 482-415 (.537) and he is 262-224 (.539) with the Phillies ... Manuel has had a winning record in all five of his full seasons as a major league manager.

FOR THE RECORD: 2007 marked the Phillies' 5th straight winning season ... It is only the 3rd time in club history that the Phillies have had 5 straight winning seasons ... The others were 9 straight from 1975-83 and 6 straight from 1962-67... **Since Opening Day of 2003, the Phillies have the 3rd-best record in the National League at 434-376 (.536)** ... Only Atlanta (450-360) and St. Louis (451-358) have better records over the last 5 seasons.

UNITED NATIONS: The Phillies have representatives from 7 different countries/territories on their 40-man roster: **Canada** (Scott Mathieson and Pete Laforest), the **Dominican Republic** (Antonio Alfonseca, Jose Mesa, Abraham Nunez and Francisco Rosario), **Japan** (Iguchi), **Panama** (Carlos Ruiz), **Puerto Rico** (J.C. Romero), **Venezuela** (Freddy Garcia) and the **United States** ... Iguchi is the first Japanese-born player in Phillies history.

NL RANKINGS: The Phillies finished in the Top 3 among NL teams in the following categories: 1st in runs (892), triples (41), RBI (850), SLG % (.458), XBH (580), total bases (2,605), BB (641) and HBP (90) ... 2nd in HR (213), OBP (.354) and SB (138) ... 3rd in hits (1,558).

DAY DREAMIN': The Phillies were 27-23 (.540) in day games this season, which were the 3rd-most day wins among NL teams, behind the Cubs (43) and Mets (30) ... They hit .285 during the day in 2007 which was 2nd-best among NL teams (Mets-.286) ... The Phillies scored 301 runs in day games, which was 2nd only to the Cubs (399), who played 31 more day games than the Phils ... **The Phils led the NL in runs/day game (6.02)** ... Four Phillies hit over .300 in day games this season: Tadahito Iguchi (.375), Aaron Rowand (.332), Chase Utley (.329) and Pat Burrell (.310) ... Ryan Howard finished 3rd in the NL in both HR (16) and RBI (48) in day games ... Only the Cubs' Aramis Ramirez (61) and Derrek Lee (50) had more RBI (in at least 23 more games).

TURNSTYLE TRAFFIC: The Phillies topped 3 million in attendance for the third time in the club's history ... The NL pennant-winning season of 1993 and 2004, the first season at Citizens Bank Park, are the other two ... The Phillies currently rank 6th in both attendance (2,973,844) and in average attendance (38,126) among NL teams ... In 77 home games this season, they have had 21 sellouts and 33 crowds of more than 40,000.
